Abstract:

Confidentiality is one of the cornerstones of mediation, but it is also one of the great areas of uncertainty of mediation. Although the necessity for confidentiality in mediation is obvious, the application of this vital element of mediation often leads to disparate and sometimes, unwanted, results. Despite advanced legislation and an ever-increasing body of case law, the application of mediation confidentiality still remains as issue.
